Israel's Unfaithfulness

Judges 1–3

STORY POINT: GOD'S PEOPLE REPEATEDLY TURNED FROM HIM.

Joshua had died. Without a strong leader, the Israelites disobeyed God and worshiped false gods. They ignored and forgot about the one true God. God let an enemy king take over the Israelites.

Then the Israelites remembered how good they had it when they loved and obeyed God. They cried out, "Save us!" God raised up Othniel to rule over them as the first judge. Othniel led the Israelites, and the land was peaceful for 40 years. Then Othniel died.

Again, Israel ignored God and forgot Him. God let the king of Moab attack the Israelites and defeat them. The Israelites remembered how good they had it when they loved and obeyed God. They cried out, "Save us!" So God raised up Ehud.

The Israelites sent Ehud to the king of Moab. Ehud hid a double-edged sword under his clothes. When the king stood up, Ehud pulled out his sword. He pushed it into the king's belly.


Ehud escaped down the porch, locking the doors of the room behind him. Ehud blew a ram's horn and became the Israelites' leader. There was peace in the land for 80 years.

When Ehud died, the Israelites ignored and forgot God again. They turned away from Him. When they remembered how good they had it when the loved and obeyed God, they cried out to Him, "Save us!" God sent a third judge, Shamgar, to save them.

Christ Connection: The judges saved the people from the consequences of their sin, but not the cause of it. God's plan was to one day send a true Deliverer—Jesus, His own Son—to be the King of His people. Jesus saves people from sin forever.

Deborah and Barak

Judges 4–5

STORY POINT: GOD USED DEBORAH, BARAK, AND JAEL TO RESCUE HIS PEOPLE.

Ehud and Shamgar had been judges over Israel. After they died, the Israelites ignored God and forgot about Him. So God allowed the king of Canaan to overtake them. The commander of the king's army was named Sisera. God's people remembered how good life was when they loved and obeyed God. They cried out to God, "Save us!"

Deborah was the judge over Israel. Deborah gave Barak a message. God said to gather an army. God would help Barak defeat Sisera.

Deborah, Barak, and the army went to Mount Tabor. Sisera took his chariots and his army to fight against Israel. Barak and his army moved down the mountain toward Sisera and his army. None of them survived except Sisera. He had escaped!

Sisera ran to the tent of Jael. Jael gave Sisera some milk to drink and covered him with a rug. Jael took a tent peg and a hammer, and used them to kill Sisera while he slept.

Barak came, looking for Sisera. Barak went into Jael's tent and saw Sisera lying dead.

That day, God allowed the Israelites to defeat the Canaanites. Deborah and Barak sang a victory song. The land was peaceful for 40 more years.

Christ Connection: God does what is for His glory and our good. (Psalm 115:3; Romans 8:28) God fought for the Israelites and used Deborah, Barak, and Jael to defeat Canaan. In a similar way, God uses people and events to not only save us from our enemies, but to teach us about our ultimate good: salvation through His Son, Jesus Christ.





Gideon

Judges 6–8

STORY POINT: GOD SHOWED GIDEON THAT VICTORY COMES FROM HIM.

The Israelites once again did not obey God, so God allowed them to be ruled by their enemies. They remembered how good life was when they loved and obeyed God. They cried out, "Save us!"

The angel of the LORD appeared to a man named Gideon and said, "The LORD is with you, mighty warrior!" The LORD had chosen Gideon to deliver the Israelites from the power of their enemy.

When the time came to go to battle, an army of men gathered behind Gideon, ready to fight.

God told Gideon that he had too many people with him. Gideon sent home everyone who was afraid to fight. Ten thousand men remained. "That's still too many," God said. God made a test for the people. All of them were to go to the river to drink the water. Anyone who knelt to drink water was sent home, but whoever lapped the water with his hand to his mouth stayed. Three hundred men remained.

That night, Israel's army ran toward the camp of Midianites. Gideon and his army chased the Midianites, and they ran away. God gave Israel the victory.

Christ Connection: The Israelites cried out to God because they knew they could not save themselves. Even Gideon was not enough to save them; God used Gideon to help His people, but God fought the battle for them. The people needed someone who was mighty to save. Jesus Christ came to save us from sin because we cannot save ourselves. Only God, through Christ, can save us.

Samson

Judges 13–16

STORY POINT: GOD GAVE SAMSON STRENGTH TO DEFEAT THE

PHILISTINES.

The Israelites disobeyed God, so God let the Philistines rule over them. God chose Samson to save the Israelites from the Philistines. God made Samson strong. When Samson grew up, Samson killed a lion. Later, some bees had made honey in the lion's body. Philistine men came

"Out of the strong came something sweet."

The riddle was about the lion and the honey, but the men could not figure it out. They asked Samson's bride for help. She told the men the answer. Samson was angry and he left.

Later, Samson fell in love with Delilah. The Philistines gave her money to find out why Samson was so strong. Samson told Delilah the truth: "If you cut my hair, I will not have my strength." So when Samson was sleeping, a Philistine man cut his hair. Delilah shouted, "Samson! Wake up! The Philistines are here to kill you!" Samson wasn't strong anymore. The Philistines took him away in chains.

One day, the Philistines made Samson stand between two pillars in their temple. Samson cried out to God, "Lord, strengthen me once more." So God strengthened Samson. Samson pushed on the pillars and collapsed the temple. Samson and everyone in the temple died, but Samson had saved the Israelites from the Philistines.

Christ Connection: Samson's sin led to his own death, but God used his death to save the Israelites from their enemies. Samson's story reminds us of Jesus. Jesus never sinned, but God sent Him to die on the cross and rise again to rescue people from sin and give them eternal life.
